# History of the CA School Dashboard

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- A Different Accountability System
  - Formerly referred to as the accountability rubrics and LCFF Dashboard
  - Multiple measures vs. results from one test
  
- Indicators that Align to State Priorities
  - [i.e. Suspension Rate - Priority 6 (School Climate)]
  - [i.e. Academic Indicator - Priority 4 (Pupil Achievement)]

# Emphasis on Status and Change

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- Status is based on the most recent year of data for the indicator.
  - Very High
  - High
  - Medium
  - Low
  - Very Low
- Change is the difference between the performance form the most recent year of data and the prior year data.
  - Increased Significantly

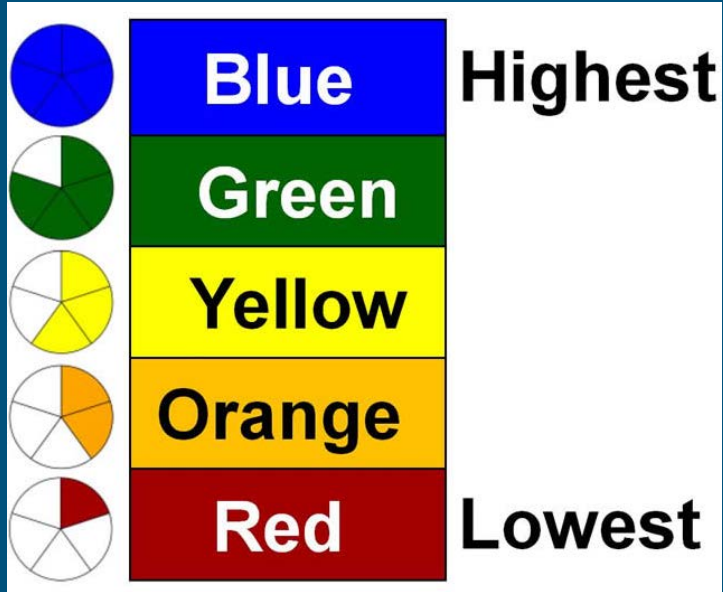
# Emphasis on Status and Change

# State Indicators

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## Chronic Absenteeism

- Available Fall 2018
- Typically a student who misses 10% or more of a school year, unexcused or excused (including suspensions) is considered chronically absent.

# State Indicators

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## Suspension Rate

- Different distributions for district, elementary, middle, and high
  - Suspension rate cut points are higher at middle school than elementary
- Number of students suspended divided by the cumulative enrollment
  - Counts students, not offenses or days!

# State Indicators

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## Graduation Rate

- Not applicable for elementary districts

# State Indicators

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## English Learner Progress

- The percent of English learners who are making progress towards language proficiency on the CELDT from one year to the next

plus

- the number of English learners reclassified to fluent English in the prior year.

# State Indicators

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## College and Career Ready

- Not applicable to elementary districts.

# State Indicators

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## Academic Indicator

- The sum of all test takers “Distance From 3” divided by the total number of test takers minus Els in US for less than 12 months minus students not continuously enrolled.
- A separate indicator is listed for ELA and Math

# Local Indicators

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Basic Services and Conditions (Appropriately Assigned Teachers, Access to Curriculum-Aligned Instructional Materials, and Safe, Clean and Functional School Facilities)  
(Priority 1)

- Reported as
  - Data Collected
  - Data Not Collected
  - Data Not Collected for Two or More Years

# Local Indicators

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## Implementation of State Academic Standards (Priority 2)

- Reported as
  - Data Collected
  - Data Not Collected
  - Data Not Collected for Two or More Years
- Two options for self-reflection
  - Provide a narrative summary of progress in the implementation of state academic standards based on locally selected measures



# Local Indicators

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## Parent Engagement (Priority 3)

- Reported as
  - Data Collected
  - Data Not Collected
  - Data Not Collected for Two or More Years
- LEAs provide a narrative summary of their progress toward: (1) seeking input from parents/guardians in school and district decision making; and (2) promoting parental participation in programs.

# Local Indicators

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## School Climate (Priority 6)

- Reported as
  - Data Collected
  - Data Not Collected
  - Data Not Collected for Two or More Years
- LEAs provide a narrative summary of a local climate survey that measures student perceptions of school safety and connectedness, such as the California Healthy Kids Survey.
