We have had numerous parents pass away, which I cannot imagine going through. We have had spouses of staff members pass away, and parents of staff members pass away this year. It has made me really think about how we each choose to live. Our lives impact others more than we may realize. Through these passings and particularly right now, through the passing of Tony DeVille Sr., I recognize we each truly can live our lives with integrity, we can make a positive difference wherever we are, and in whatever positions we have, we can hold ourselves accountable to be the best we can be, and we can live lives of love, passion, and service to others like Tony did. He has been an inspiration to all of us. We will never forget the legacy his life provided us. He has had a profound effect on each of us, and I want to honor that tonight. Dr. Robyn Silverman stated, "You need not worry about how you will be remembered. Instead focus on living a life of character, conviction, and compassion and your legacy will never be forgotten." To me, this sums up Tony DeVille Sr. His legacy will never be forgotten. Superintendent Olson and Principal Kathy Miracle recognized Raelene Nunn from the El Dorado County Senior Services as Outstanding Community Member for her contributions to our district schools.

Currently we are in full swing with student listening circles. The information we get from the kids is inspiring! We have just compiled 996 individual comments from the open ended questions on the parent survey that closed on Monday. We were able to see trends emerge with very positive comments about staff, communication and understandably some concerns regarding safety.

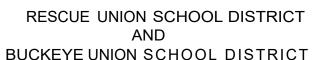

JOINT FOOD SERVICE DIRECTOR AGREEMENT FOR THE 2018-2019 SCHOOL YEAR

BY AND BETWEEN





This Agreement is made and entered into on this 8th day of May, 2018 by and between the RESCUE UNION SCHOOL DISTRICT of El Dorado County, (hereinafter referred to as "Rescue") and the BUCKEYE UNION SCHOOL DISTRICT of El Dorado County, (hereinafter referred to as "Buckeye"), regarding the maintenance of a joint food service director delivery model for each school district's food service program.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Rescue and Buckeye mutually desire to provide food service for pupils in their districts in the most effective and economical way possible;

WHEREAS, both Rescue and Buckeye have thoroughly investigated the joint service of a food service director, and have found that such a joint service provision to be the most cost effective and efficient method by which to provide supervision of their respective food service programs; and

WHEREAS, California Education Code Section 35160 provides authority by which districts may jointly provide for food service; and

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE ACTS AND PROMISES CONTAINED HEREIN, the parties agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. SERVICES:

Either party may avail itself of the Food Services Director services of the Rescue Food Services Department in accordance with the terms set out herein.

Buckeye will receive the following services from the Joint Food Services Director, such duties to include but not be limited to:

- Schedules, allots time, and assigns food services personnel for all food **--**J services operations with the school district.
- **--**J Instructs, supervises, and evaluates food service personnel.

- Consults with management about facility design, needed equipment and food service operations.
- Maintains accurate records and reviews all state reports.

MANAGEMENT:

The parties shall meet to discuss issues and operating procedures through which food service supervision and evaluation of joint services will be provided.

3. MUTUAL AID:

Parties agree to provide mutual aid to each other upon request. Such mutual aid shall include, but not necessarily be limited to substitute food service employees.

4. PAYMENT:

Buckeye will reimburse Rescue for Food Service Director services in an amount equal to 50% of the cost of the Food Services Director annual salary, mileage stipend and benefits.

Rescue shall be responsible for maintaining employee records; i.e., health benefits, sick leave, vacation and compensatory time.

5. TIME OF PAYMENT:

Buckeye shall pay Rescue on a quarterly basis within 30 days of billing.

6. LIABILITY:

Parties agree to mutually indemnify each other for any liability which arises out of or is related to any claim for damages arising out of or related to the services provided by the Food Services Director. It is agreed and understood that such indemnification shall include the cost of defense of any litigation or other legal action that may result.

7. <u>TERM/RENEWAL OF CONTRACT:</u>

This agreement shall be for a period of one year beginning July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019. It may be renewed for additional terms of one year by the following procedure:

a. On or before February 15th of each year, Rescue shall notify Buckeye if it wishes to continue this agreement, and of any modifications it desires in terms or conditions.

- b. Within 60 days after receipt of notification from Rescue, Buckeye shall respond, either accepting the continuation of the agreement with its modifications, rejecting the continuation of the agreement, or counter offering a continuation with new modifications.
- c. If Buckeye accepts the continuation, but makes new modifications, the parties shall have 30 days in which to reach a final agreement.

BACKGROUND:

The main funding stream for school districts is the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) and is based on the average daily attendance (ADA) of students enrolled in the district. The State requires districts to submit an attendance report in May (P-2) that discloses the district's average daily attendance for all full school months through April 15th.

STATUS:

The attached P-2 Report is presented for your review. The P-2 report shows a total ADA of 3,522.13, which is s year over year decrease of 88.81 ADA from 2016-17 P-2 ADA (3,610.94).

For districts experiencing declining enrollment, funding is based on the greater of the current year or prior year P-2 ADA. For the last several years, we have been funded on prior year ADA, due to declining enrollment.

Looking forward, the 2018-19 enrollment estimates reflect declining enrollment, therefore the initial budget will, once again, be based on prior year ADA.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no impact to the current year budget. Revenues that are budgeted based on current year ADA, such as Lottery, will be adjusted after the annual report in June.

AGENDA ITEM: Adoption of Resolution 18-12

To Review and Establish Fund Balance Policies

BACKGROUND:

The Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) issued Standard 54 which changed the requirements for how fund balances are displayed. The Board adopted a policy implementing this standard in June of 2011 which required an annual review and revised these policies in May of 2013.

STATUS:

This resolution fulfills the GASB requirement to review and establish the fund balance policies for the District on an annual basis.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The fund balance policies will be incorporated in the 2018-2019 Fiscal Year Budget.

BOARD GOAL:

Board Focus Goal II – FISCAL ACCOUNTABILITY

Keep the district fiscally solvent through prudent LCAP aligned budget processes in order to meet the needs of our students.

RECOMMENDATION:

District staff recommends the Board of Trustees approve Resolution 18-12 reviewing and establishing fund balance policies.

Rescue Union School District RESOLUTION NO. 18-12

TO REVIEW AND ESTABLISH FUND BALANCE POLICIES

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting of the Rescue Union School District Board of Trustees held on June 28, 2011, the Board adopted Resolution 11-13 establishing a minimum fund balance and

WHEREAS, the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Standard 54 requires the policy to be revisited each year and

WHEREAS, Resolution 13-09 revised the policy on May 14, 2013 and

WHEREAS, the Rescue Union School District wishes to continue to employ the minimum fund balance policy established by Resolution 13-09

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees hereby adopts the following policy:

FUND BALANCE POLICY

Fund balance measures the net financial resources available to finance expenditures of future periods. The District's Unassigned General Fund Balance will be maintained to provide the District with sufficient working capital and a margin of safety to address local and regional emergencies without borrowing. The Unassigned General Fund Balance may only be appropriated by resolution of the Board of Trustees.

Fund Balance of the District may be committed for a specific source by formal action of the Board of Trustees. Amendments or modification to the committed fund balance must also be approved by formal action of the Board of Trustees. Committed fund balance does not lapse at year-end. The formal action required to commit fund balance shall be by board resolution or majority vote.

The Board of Trustees delegates authority to assign fund balance for a specific purpose to the Superintendent or designee of the District.

For purposes of fund balance classification, expenditures are to be spent from restricted fund balance first and then unrestricted. Expenditures incurred in the unrestricted fund balances shall be reduced first from the committed fund balance, then from the assigned fund balance and lastly, the unassigned fund balance.

The Board of Trustees recognizes that good fiscal management comprises the foundational support of the entire District. To make that support as effective as possible, the Board intends to maintain a minimum fund balance of 10% of the District's general fund annual operating expenditures. If a fund balance drops below 10%, it shall be recovered at a rate of 1% minimally, each year.

This policy should be revisited each year for review.

BACKGROUND:

In January of 2017, the Governing Board of the Rescue Union School District established an RFQ and RFP from qualified providers of Lease-Leaseback ("L/LB") construction services for the Construction of a Two-Story Classroom Building, Sitework and Modernization Project at Marina Village Middle School. The District received qualification packets from five construction services firms, all of whom were prequalified to submit a fee based proposal on the Project. Subsequently, three of the construction services firms submitted a fee based proposal on the project by which contracts will be awarded by the Board under the provisions of Education Code 17406 et seq.

Through the facility planning process, the District identified modernization projects throughout the District including the construction of a two-story classroom building at Marina Village Middle School. The estimated construction cost of the Marina Village Two-Story Classroom Building Project is approximately \$6.5 million.

• Marina Village Middle School:

The District expand the permanent capacity on the campus of Marina Village Middle School, a District-owned site located at 1901 Francisco Drive, El Dorado Hills, California 95762 by constructing a new two-story classroom building and completing other site work, and modernization work related to the Project.

On March 14, 2017, the Governing Board passed Resolution #17-07 delegating to the Superintendent, or their designee, the authority to enter into the Lease Leaseback Contract for Construction Services, the Site Lease, and Sublease Agreement and other acts relating to the Marina Village Two-Story Classroom Project with Carter-Kelly Inc. who provided the best value in the competitive procurement process as directed under the provisions of Education Code 17406 *et seq*.

The District received approval of the plans from the Division of State Architects (DSA) on March 8, 2017 allowing Carter-Kelly Inc. to determine its Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) on the Marina Village Two-Story Classroom Project once bids were submitted by qualified subcontractors. The total construction cost for the project is \$6,486,004. In addition, the LLB Construction Services Contract with Carter-Kelly Inc. at 11.5% is \$745,890, thereby generating a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) of \$7,231,894. This contract was approved by the board at the June 13, 2017 meeting.

At the December 12, 2017 board meeting, Change Orders #1-4 were approved for a net change to the contract of \$28,146. When added to the original contract amount, the revised contract was \$7,260,040.00.

At the January 23, 2018 board meeting, Change Orders #5 - 9 were approved for a net change to the contract of \$250,036.00. When added to the revised contract amount, the updated contract was \$7,510,076.00.

At the April 10, 2018 board meeting, Change Orders #10 - 16 were approved for a net change to the contract of \$18,167.00. When added to the revised contract amount, the updated contract was \$7,528,243.00.

STATUS:

Carter Kelly, Inc. has begun the construction of the two-story classroom project and site work at Marina Village Middle School and has submitted Change Orders #17-22 for a net increase of \$7,955.00 to the contract.

STATUS:

The authorization of the Individual Services Agreement will provide for services from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018.
