CSD Mission Statement: "Enhancing the quality of life for El Dorado Hills Residents through innovative, responsible leadership and by providing superior service and facilities."

# **Rescue Union School District**

**AGENDA ITEM:** Comprehensive Facility Use Report

# **BACKGROUND:**

As prescribed by the Civic Centers Act (*California Education Code Section 38130*), the Rescue Union School District makes available its facilities to the public pursuant to LEA board policies and procedures. Rescue Union School District uses a formal process that begins at the school site and concludes with the approval of the Maintenance and Operations Coordinator. Under the Civic Centers Act, school districts are allowed to reclaim reasonable costs associated with public use of school facilities. Therefore, it is imperative for school district's to review its policies and determine the reasonable costs associated with public use of the district's facilities.

# **STATUS/DISCUSSION:**

The District currently makes available its facilities to fifty organizations within the community. The District Facilities Team will provide data and anecdotal information to the Board in order to evaluate the current fee structure and policies employed by the District. Specifically, the board requested to discuss the following section of BP 1330 – "School-related activities shall have priority in the use of school facilities and grounds. Other uses authorized under the Civic Center Act shall be on a first-come, first-served basis." The board asked to review the scheduling of district facilities when multiple organizations have interest in use.

# **FISCAL IMPACT:**

The fiscal impact of facility use fees was \$123,990 in 2016-17.

# **BOARD GOAL(S):**

Board Focus Goal II - FISCAL ACCOUNTABILITY:

Keep the district fiscally solvent through prudent budget processes in order to meet the needs of our students.

Board Focus Goal V – FACILITY/HOUSING:

Build, improve and maintain school facilities to meet current and future education needs while integrating the most effective and efficient use of resources.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

The District staff recommends the Board increase custodial rates from \$45 per hour to \$50 per hour due to increased personnel costs.

Staff would also like to discuss eliminating the \$25 application fee for level I organizations, and the creation of a bathroom usage fee of \$20 per facility use, for paper goods/supplies/utilities, for level II and III organizations.

Finally, the staff would recommend increasing the maximum for monthly field use from \$500/month to \$600/month per field (Equal to 40 hours of paid use).

# **Use Of School Facilities**

The Governing Board believes that school facilities and grounds are a vital community resource which should be used to foster community involvement and development. Therefore, the Board authorizes the use of school facilities by district residents and community groups for purposes specified in the Civic Center Act, to the extent that such use does not interfere with school activities or other school-related uses.

(cf. 6145.5 - Student Organizations and Equal Access)

School-related activities shall have priority in the use of school facilities and grounds. Other uses authorized under the Civic Center Act shall be on a first-come, first-served basis.

As necessary to ensure efficient use of school facilities, the Superintendent or designee may, with the Board's approval, enter into an agreement for the joint use of any school facilities or grounds. The Board shall approve any such agreement only if it determines that it is in the best interest of the district and the community.

(cf. 1330.1 - Joint Use Agreements)

Subject to prior approval by the Board, the Superintendent or designee may grant the use of school facilities on those days on which the school is closed. (Education Code 37220)

(cf. 6115 - Ceremonies and Observances)

For the effective management and control of school facilities and grounds, the Superintendent or designee shall maintain procedures and regulations that: (Education Code 38133)

- 1. Aid, encourage, and assist groups desiring to use school facilities for approved activities
- 2. Preserve order in school buildings and on school grounds and protect school facilities, designating a person to supervise this task, if necessary

(cf. 0450 - Comprehensive School Safety Plan)

(cf. 3516 - Emergencies and Disaster Preparedness Plan)

3. Ensure that the use of school facilities or grounds is not inconsistent with their use for school purposes and does not interfere with the regular conduct of school work

There shall be no advertising on school facilities and grounds except as allowed by district policy specified in BP 1325 - Advertising and Promotion.

(cf. 1325 - Advertising and Promotion)

Fees

The Board authorizes the use of school facilities or grounds without charge by nonprofit organizations, clubs, or associations organized to promote youth and school activities. In accordance with Education Code 38134(a), these groups include, but are not limited to, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, Camp Fire USA, YMCA, parent-teacher associations, and school-community advisory councils. Other groups that request the use of school facilities under the Civic Center Act, including nonprofit groups not organized to promote youth and school activities and for-profit groups, shall be charged an amount not to exceed direct costs. However, if the use of school facilities or grounds is for religious services, the group shall be charged an amount that equals or exceeds direct costs determined in accordance with Education Code 38134.

In determining direct costs to be charged for community use of school facilities or grounds, including, but not limited to, playing or athletic fields, track and field venues, tennis courts, and outdoor basketball courts, the Superintendent or designee shall include a proportionate share of the costs of the following: (Education Code 38134)

- 1. Supplies, utilities, janitorial services, other services of district employees, and salaries of district employees directly associated with operation and maintenance of the school facilities or grounds involved
- 2. Maintenance, repair, restoration, and refurbishment of the school facilities or grounds

However, for classroom-based programs that operate after school hours, including, but not limited to, after-school, tutoring, and child care programs, direct costs to be charged shall not include the cost of maintenance, repair, restoration, or refurbishment of the school facilities or grounds. (Education Code 38134)

Groups shall be charged fair rental value when using school facilities or grounds for entertainment or meetings where admission is charged or contributions solicited and net receipts are not to be expended for charitable purposes or for the welfare of the district's students. (Education Code 38134)

# **Use Of School Facilities**

Application for Use of Facilities

Any person applying for the use of any school facilities or grounds on behalf of any society, group, or organization shall present written authorization from the group or organization to make the application.

Persons or organizations applying for the use of school facilities or grounds shall submit a facilities use statement indicating that they uphold the state and federal constitutions and do not intend to use school premises or facilities to commit unlawful acts.

Civic Center Use

Subject to district policies and regulations, school facilities and grounds shall be available to citizens and community groups as a civic center for the following purposes: (Education Code 32282, 38131)

- 1. Public, literary, scientific, recreational, educational, or public agency meetings
- 2. The discussion of matters of general or public interest
- 3. The conduct of religious services for temporary periods, on a one-time or renewable basis, by any church or religious organization
- 4. Child care programs to provide supervision and activities for children of preschool and elementary school age
- (cf. 5148 Child Care and Development)
- (cf. 5148.2 Before/After School Programs)
- (cf. 5148.3 Preschool/Early Childhood Education)
- 5. The administration of examinations for the selection of personnel or the instruction of precinct board members by public agencies
- 6. Supervised recreational activities, including, but not limited to, sports league activities that are arranged for and supervised by entities, including religious organizations or churches, and in which youth may participate regardless of religious belief or denomination
- 7. A community youth center
- (cf. 1020 Youth Services)
- 8. Mass care and welfare shelters during disasters or other emergencies affecting the public health and welfare
- (cf. 0450 Comprehensive Safety Plan)
- (cf. 3516 Emergencies and Disaster Preparedness Plan)
- 9. A ceremony, patriotic celebration, or related educational assembly conducted by a veterans' organization

A veterans' organization means the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Disabled American Veterans, United Spanish War Veterans, Grand Army of the Republic, or other duly recognized organization of honorably discharged soldiers, sailors, or marines of the United States, or any of their territories. (Military and Veterans Code 1800)

10. Other purposes deemed appropriate by the Governing Board

# Restrictions

School facilities or grounds shall not be used for any of the following activities:

- 1. Any use by an individual or group for the commission of any crime or any act prohibited by law
- 2. Any use which is inconsistent with the use of the school facilities for school purposes or which interferes with the regular conduct of school or school work
- 3. Any use which involves the possession, consumption, or sale of alcoholic beverages or any restricted substances, including tobacco

(cf. 3513.3 - Tobacco-Free Schools)

The district may exclude certain school facilities from nonschool use for safety or security reasons.

# Damage and Liability

Groups, organizations, or persons using school facilities or grounds shall be liable for any property damage caused by the activity. The district may charge the amount necessary to repair the damages and may deny the group further use of school facilities or grounds. (Education Code 38134)

Any group or organization using school facilities or grounds shall be liable for any injuries resulting from its negligence during the use of district facilities or grounds. The group shall bear the cost of insuring against this risk and defending itself against claims arising from this risk. (Education Code 38134)

Groups or organizations shall provide the district with evidence of insurance against claims arising out of the group's own negligence when using school facilities. (Education Code 38134)

As permitted, the Superintendent or designee may require a hold harmless agreement and indemnification when warranted by the type of activity or the specific facilities being used.

There is a \$8 million 2-story building project occurring at Marina Village, \$2 million in debt service related to Measure K, and over \$500k in debt service related to COP 2010. Additionally, the district has taken on new debt service for COP 2017 that will start in 2018.

# **STATUS/DISCUSSION:**

The board has requested a discussion regarding our current facility funds and the activities that are happening in the district. Staff will present the district current funding for facilities, the activities occurring in each fund, the purpose and history of each fund, and information about the current ability to fund future facility needs.

# **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Between all five facility funds the district is budgeted to spend in excess of \$10M.

# FACILITY FUNDS AND BALANCES AS OF JULY 1, 2017

- Fund 21 Measure K Bond Fund \$428,115

# FUND 21 – MEASURE K BOND FUND

# HISTORY AND CURRENT STATUS

- This fund was opened for the Measure K Bond that was approved on April 14, 1998.
- THE DISTRICT ESTIMATED THE ASSESSMENT AT \$25.00 PER \$100,000.
- THE BOND AUTHORIZED UP TO \$27,000,000 IN FUNDS.
- THE COMMUNITY APPROVED MEASURE K AT 75.8% APPROVAL RATE.

- DUE TO LENGTH OF TIME SINCE THE ISSUANCE OF THE REMAINING FUNDS HAVE BEEN USED TO REDEEM (PAY DOWN) SOME OF THE OUTSTANDING BOND BALANCE WHICH WILL LOWER THE OUTSTANDING DEBT OWED AND BENEFIT OUR TAX PAYERS.
- THE FUND WILL BE CLOSED PRIOR TO DECEMBER 31, 2017.



# FUND 25 – DEVELOPER FEE FUND

# HISTORY AND CURRENT STATUS

- THE PURPOSE OF COLLECTING FEES ON DEVELOPMENT IS TO ACQUIRE FUNDS TO CONSTRUCT OR RECONSTRUCT SCHOOL FACILITIES FOR THE STUDENTS GENERATED BY NEW DEVELOPMENTS.
- THE DISTRICT'S USE OF THE FEE WILL INVOLVE CONSTRUCTING NEW SCHOOL FACILITIES. IN ADDITION, THE FEE MAY BE USED FOR RECONSTRUCTION ON EXISTING FACILITIES, DESIGN OF SCHOOL FACILITIES, PURCHASE OF LAND, PERMITS AND PLAN FEES, FURNITURE FOR USE IN NEW SCHOOL FACILITIES, ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS.

- THE DISTRICT COMPLETED A JUSTIFICATION STUDY IN JUNE 2016 AND IS CURRENTLY APPROVED FOR \$3.48/SQFT AND RECEIVES \$2.17 WITH THE BALANCE GOING TO EDUHS
- CURRENTLY, FUNDS ARE BUDGETED TO PAY FOR 62.5% OF THE DEBT SERVICE ON THE 2010 COP, 33.33% OF THE M&O SUPERVISOR COSTS, AND FEES FOR COLLECTION SERVICES.
- THE 2017 COP DEBT SERVICE WILL BE PAID PARTIALLY FROM FUND 25.
- REVENUES ARE BUDGETED FOR \$400,000 FOR 2017-18



# FUND 35 – SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION FUND

# HISTORY AND CURRENT STATUS

- FUND 35 IS USED TO RECORD PROJECTS THAT WILL RECEIVE FUNDING FROM THE STATE SCHOOL FACILITY PROGRAM.
- THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS ARE BEING TRACKED IN FUND 35 WITH POSSIBLE STATE MATCHING FUNDS
  - MARINA VILLAGE 2-STORY BUILDING (\$3.2M)
  - RESCUE MP ROOM (\$760k)
  - Lake Forest K Classroom (\$1.5M)
  - Green Valley K Classroom (\$2.3M)

ALL THESE PROJECTS ARE ONLY IN DESIGN PHASE EXCEPT MV 2-STORY. DISTRICT MATCHING FUNDS FOR THE OUTSTANDING PROJECTS IS \$7.76M

- ACTIVITY INTO FUND 35 FOR 2017-18

LEASE FINANCING ENABLES SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO FINANCE CAPITAL ASSETS OVER A MULTI-YEAR PERIOD WITHOUT VOTER APPROVAL. IN EFFECT, A LEASE FINANCING IS A BORROWING TO BE REPAID OVER TIME FROM THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S GENERAL FUND.

# **BACKGROUND:**

Through a partnership with Senator Mike McGuire and the California Air Resources Board (CARB) the North Coast Unified Air Quality Management District was asked to administer the Rural School Bus Pilot Project for the State of California. The main goal of this grant program is accelerating the turnover of California school bus fleets to lower carbon transportation choices, especially in rural school districts who have less access to other funding sources.

Traditionally, small and rural school districts have the oldest and dirtiest burning fleets, and historically have not had the opportunity or ability to receive funds for replacement or upgrade projects. According the US EPA, more than half of today's school buses have been in service for over a decade. These older buses emit twice as much pollution per mile as a semi-truck. Consequently, health risks for students, especially younger children, increase significantly because their respiratory systems are still developing.

# **STATUS:**

Rescue Union School District submitted applications for three buses to the Rural School Bus Pilot Project Grant and was awarded a grant of \$405,000 to replace Bus #16 with a new electric bus. In addition, the District will install a new charging station estimated to cost \$40,000.

The agreement with the Rural School Bus Pilot Project has been fully executed and in accordance with Attachment A, Section 6 of the Grant Agreement, purchase orders must be placed within 30 days of the agreement execution.

# **FISCAL IMPACT:**

The value of the grant is \$405,000. The District will install a bus charging station estimated at \$40,000.

# **BOARD GOAL:**

Board Focus Goal II – FISCAL ACCOUNTABILITY:

Keep the district fiscally solvent through prudent budget processes in order to meet the needs of our students.

# **RECOMMENDATION:**

District staff recommends the Board of Trustees approve the purchase order and contract for the new electric school bus.
