REPORTS AND COMMUNICATION:	
Presentation: MJ's Project (Supplement) (Presentation)	The Board heard a presentation regarding a non-profit charity collection and distribution program. This program was formed during the 2018-19 school year in response to needs at our local high schools and middle schools.
3. Superintendent's Report (Supplement)	Superintendent Olson reported on the kick off to the 2019-2020 school year starting with our fourth annual Day in Paradise theme! The day began with a welcome breakfast, introductions of new staff members, trivia questions and Jamba Juice cards thrown to the winners. Mrs. Olson shared some practical strategies for all staff to use in practicing self-care, and then everyone participated in a presentation from Matt McCue on effective verbal de-

escalation strategies. The morning ended with CalPERS representatives answering questions for current staff and retirees regarding our new insurance.

Our Back-to-School nights are underway. Pleasant Grove's is hosting theirs this evening, with Rescue School tomorrow evening and Marina Village on Thursday.

Mrs. Olson presented a certificate to Dave Scroggins from Assemblyman Kevin Kiley and shared an article from the Village Life highlighting his ACSA Administrator of Year award.

4. Department Update:

Curriculum and Instruction

Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction, Dave Scroggins, provided an overview of activities this past summer.

New York Creek Project

In partnership with Oak Ridge High School's Science Department, RUSD teachers including Sarah Fitzhugh, Michelle Noble, and Erin Shoemake, and Renee Mallot worked to develop online, NGSS aligned lessons that fit into the outdoor learning stations found along the New York Creek Trail. Teachers and community members will be able to download these lessons in advance, or use QR codes posted along the trail to access lessons on the spot. Lessons span elementary grades through high school and more are in the works. This will prove to be a highly valuable community resource for years to come.

ESGI Training

On August 1, Lynn Scales and Jenny Riley led a team of TK, kindergarten, and first grade teachers, demonstrating how to use the ESGI Primary Assessment System. Teachers were trained in how to build assessments, how to use the tool with students, and how to create support resources for parents to use at home. Time was also allotted for teachers to develop assessments for their classes.

Assessment Development

On August 2, a team of teachers met to develop Common Core aligned assessments to help inform parents on progress toward standards. While these assessments would ideally be used by all teachers within a grade level, they would not replace, nor be included on, the required district benchmark assessment list. Instead, they would serve as additional common tools that teachers can rely on to assess and report progress and more accurately complete report cards.

Kelly Rizzi Restorative Practices

On August 2, a team of teachers, counselors, and administrators met with Kelly Rizzi to be trained on restorative approaches for addressing student behaviors. The group studied and practiced restorative circles and restorative chats. These classroom management strategies, and more, will be shared with all teachers on the October 14 Staff Development Day.

New Hire Onboarding

On August 9, we welcomed 24 new certificated teachers into the district with an onboarding event. During this time, the Human Resources Department, Business Services, and Technology each shared important processes, protocols, and practices. After lunch, veteran teachers provided a curriculum overview and RUFT representatives closed the day with information about union membership.

EL Newcomer Informational Night

Amy Bohren and Brittney Kernan put on a wonderful and informative dinner to welcome new English learner families to the District. Information was provided about standards, stakeholder engagement, report cards, holidays, various school events, and special education.

It's Gann Limit Calculation Time

The Gann Limit (named for Paul Gann, the author of Proposition 4 which amended the State Constitution to establish this limit) is intended to constrain the growth in state and local government spending by linking year-to-year changes in expenditures to changes in inflation (represented by per capita personal income) and population (represented by average daily attendance [ADA] for schools). Established in 1979 following the enactment of Proposition 13 and subsequently amended by Proposition 111, the Gann Limit has become a largely pro forma calculation that no longer constrains governmental expenditures. This is because the limit has grown significantly faster than appropriations subject to the limit.

Education Code Section 42132 requires that on or before September 15 of each year, the governing board of each school district adopt a resolution to identify the estimated appropriations limit for the current fiscal year and the actual appropriations limit for the preceding fiscal year. The resolution must be adopted at a regular or special meeting of the governing board.

The Gann Limit is calculated by multiplying the prior-year limit by the percentage change in ADA and per capita personal income. There is no need to pull out your calculators, though, as the state's Standardized Account Code Structure (SACS) software does all of the work for you (see SACS Form GANN). The software includes the 3.85% statewide factor for per capita personal income change. Once you have uploaded the data from your financial software and entered prior year and current year estimated ADA in SACS Form A, the SACS software will calculate the percentage change in ADA for you and use the combination of these factors to provide you with the change in your district's Gann Limit.

The next step is to determine how much of your district's local resources are subject to that limit. It is important to understand that not all revenue sources count against your district's Gann Limit. Gann Limits only constrain the appropriations from state and local tax sources—therefore federal aid is excluded as well as nontax income, such as revenues from cafeteria sales, adult education fees, and foundations. Once again, the SACS software does the hard work for you as the Form GANN within the SACS software is prepopulated based on the data imported from your financial software.

Let's step back from the calculations for a moment and paint a mental picture of how the Gann Limit works. Envision the dollar amount of your district's Gann Limit as a bucket and this bucket can hold \$50 million (the calculated Gann Limit). First, put your local property taxes that count toward your Local Control Funding Formula entitlement into this bucket, including appropriate district interest income. Next, pour all of the district's other unrestricted state aid into this bucket. Per Government Code Section (G.C.) 7906, the amount of state aid that fills up the bucket counts toward your district's Gann Limit, while the amount that overflows the bucket counts toward the state's Gann Limit. (Note that all state aid for categorical programs always counts toward the state's Gann Limit.) Through this process, as much state aid as possible counts toward school agency Gann Limits. By reducing the amount of state aid that counts toward the state's Gann Limit in this manner, this process helps the state avoid being over its Gann Limit.

Through this calculation, the revenues of nearly every local education agency are close to if not exactly at its Gann Limit. Furthermore, if any school agency should find itself over its Gann Limit, for any reason, that agency may adopt a Governing Board resolution increasing its Gann Limit by the amount needed and then

inform the Director of the Department of Finance, who must then reduce the state's Gann Limit by an equal dollar amount (see G.C. 7902.1).

To summarize, school agencies are required to perform Gann Limit calculations by the State Constitution; but it is also important for them to complete these calculations to identify how much state aid counts toward the local agency's Gann Limit, so that the state of California knows how much state aid counts toward its own Gann Limit.

- 3. Safety issues will be addressed. You must show you have an understanding of what must be done to guard against injury, and what will be done if someone gets hurt.
- 4. Action steps for further detailed planning are included. You must make a list of the key steps you will take to make sure your plan will have enough details so it can be carried out successfully.
- 5. You are on the right track with a reasonable chance for a positive experience.

When completing your proposal you only need enough detail to show a reviewer that you can meet the tests above. If showing that you meet the tests requires a lengthy and complicated proposal, your project might be more complex than necessary. Remember, the proposal is only the *beginnings* of planning. Most of your planning will come with the next step, preparation of your project plan.

If your project does not require materials or supplies, etc., simply mark those spaces "not applicable." As a reminder, do not begin any work, or raise any money, or obtain any materials, until your project proposal has been approved.

Consider also, that if you submit your proposal too close to your 18th birthday, it may not be approved in time to finish planning and executing the project.

Working with Your Project Beneficiary

On the last two pages of this workbook there is an information sheet called, "Navigating the Eagle Scout Service Project." This is for you to print and give to the religious institution, school, or community that will benefit from your efforts. You should do this as part of your first meeting with your beneficiary and use the sheet to help explain how the Eagle Scout service project works. Be sure to read it carefully so you can explain what it says.

"Navigating the Eagle Scout Service Project" will help you communicate a number of things to your beneficiary. For example, it provides thanks and congratulations for accepting the project; and it gives some background, discusses the requirements, and points out the responsibilities connected with approving your project proposal. It also explains that the beneficiary has the right to review, and also to require changes in your project plan.

Again, be sure to read carefully "Navigating the Eagle Scout Service Project" so you will have a full understanding of the role of your beneficiary.

Once your proposal is approved, you are **strongly encouraged** to prepare your project plan using the form in this workbook. Doing so increases the likelihood your project will be approved at your Eagle Scout board of review. As you begin preparing it, you should meet with a project coach. Check with the person who handled the approval of your project proposal to learn how coaches are designated in your community.

Your designated coach can help you avoid the common pitfalls associated with Eagle Scout service projects and be a big part of your success. You may also want to talk to your unit leader. 

BACKGROUND:

Action Supportive Care to provide specialized health care services to students, on behalf of the District, which are in accordance with the student's individual health care plan and to provide general support of student's health care needs in the absence of the health office nurse.

STATUS:

The approval of this contract will provide for specialized services from July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020.

FISCAL IMPACT:

These costs are included in the Districts' current budget.

BOARD GOAL:

Board Focus Goal I – STUDENT NEEDS:

A. Student Safety and Well Being: Enhance and encourage social, emotional, ethical and civic learning by providing a safe, supportive, and diverse environment.

RECOMMENDATION:

District administration recommends the Board approve the Master Contract as recommended with Action Supportive Care for the 2019-2020 school year.

Agreement for Professional Expert/Consultant Services

This agreement made and entered into this July 1, 2019, by and between the Rescue Union School District, Student support Services, hereinafter referred to as "RUSD", and Action Supportive Care Services, hereinafter referred to as "Consultant".

This agreement shall commence on July 1, 2019, and shall continue until and including June 30, 2020.

WHEREAS, RUSD is desirous of having certain special services performed: and

WHEREAS, Consultant, is willing to perform such services.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual promises and agreements herein

Contained, IT IS AGREED by and between the parties hereto as follows:

1.0 Scope of Work

The parties agree that consultant is to provide nursing services, under the terms and conditions of this agreement and in accordance with any applicable requirements of federal or state special education regulations, local laws, rules and/or regulations, third party reimbursement sources (public or private) or other reimbursement sources covering Consultant's services. The nursing/health instruction aide services are to be provided in the students' school of attendance, or in certain circumstances, at agreed field trip locations. Consultant agrees that all services will be rendered with regard to conditions of participation and reimbursement coverage required by governmental and third party reimbursement sources.

In the event that a Special Education Student(s) does not attend school, whether due to illness or any other reason, the scheduled, skilled nurse, that has previously been assigned to also care for a General Education student, would continue to provide care for the duration of time needed, no less than 4 hours, by that General Education Student(s) Skilled Nurse. Should a General Education Student not need the entire 4 hours, the Skilled Nurse would assist with any other Skilled Nursing needs on any campus. Consultant will notify Student Services via email to kamaral@rescueusd.org and this care would be billed to the RUSD, Student Support Services.

In the event that the General Education student has a field trip, Consultant will provide care for the duration of time needed, no less than 4 hours. Consultant will notify Health Services via email to kamaral@rescueusd.org and this care would be billed to the RUSD, Student Support Services.

In the event that Consultant is unable to provide service, whether due to illness or any other reason,

Consultant will notify Student Support Services Secretary, Kim Amaral, and school nurse for
the school as soon as possible. Action Supportive Care Services will make every effort to offer a
replacement.

Such services shall, at times, include travel and may be performed at other locations, specifically authorized by RUSD.

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2.0 Independent Contractor

This agreement does not constitute a hiring of consultant by RUSD. It is the parties' intention that so far as shall be in conformity with the law the consultant shall be an independent contractor and not an RUSD employee. In conformity therewith the Consultant shall retain sole and absolute discretion and judgment in the manner and means of providing consulting services to the RUSD. This agreement shall not be construed as a partnership and RUSD shall not be liable for any obligation incurred by the Consultant. However, Consultant shall comply with all policies, rules and regulations of the RUSD in connection with the provision of the Consultant's services. All services rendered by the Consultant shall be rendered in a competent, efficient and satisfactory manner and in strict accordance with the currently approved methods and practices in the Consultant's professional specialty. The Consultant assumes professional and administrative responsibility for the services rendered only to the extent that:

- a. The RUSD is responsible for assuring itself that the Consultant is qualified by education and/or experience to render the services contract for; and
- b. The Consultant is satisfying all of the obligations herein set forth.

3.0 Amendment of Scope of Work

Said scope of work may be amended with the written approval of both Consultant and RUSD.

4.0 Payment Schedule

Consultant will be compensated by RUSD for services rendered on a fee-for-service basis from the first day of a month to the end of the same month (hereinafter referred to as the "billing period") according to invoices submitted to RUSD via email to kamaral@rescueusd.org no later than five (5) days following the end of the billing period in which said services were rendered.

- \$55.00/hour will be charged for the following services:
 - Skilled nursing services performed by an RN/LVN, including administration of medications
- \$30.00/hour will be charged for the following services:
 - Health/Instruction Aide
- \$55/hour will be charged for the following services:
 - Out of Area/Overnight Field Trips

(Travel time and/or mileage at the current business mileage reimbursement rate as defined by the IRS at https://www.irs.gov/tax-professionals/standard-mileage-rate may be charged for field trips greater than or equal to 30 miles from the downtown Sacramento area, if the nurse if required to drive his or her own vehicle)

Invoices will include:

- The Name of the Contractor
- Services Dates, Hours of Services rendered, charges applicable.

Any amendments or changes to the schedule of fees hereinabove stated shall be effective thirty days (30) following the date upon which the parties hereto agree to such amendment or change in writing. Upon parties' mutual acceptance in writing, the amended schedule of fees shall become part of this agreement.

5.0 Records

Consultant shall maintain at all times complete detailed records with regard to work performed under this agreement in a form acceptable to RUSD, and RUSD shall have the right to inspect such records at any reasonable time. Notwithstanding any other terms to this agreement, no payments shall be made to Consultant until RUSD is satisfied that work of such value has been rendered pursuant to this agreement.

6.0 Non-Assignability

This agreement and the rights and duties there under shall not be assigned in whole or in part without the express written consent of RUSD.

7.0 Compensation Insurance

RUSD shall not provide worker's compensation insurance coverage for Consultant.

Consultant shall maintain general liability insurance, including automobile coverage with limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage. Where requested, the coverage shall be primary as to RUSD and shall name RUSD as an additional insured. Copies of all policies or certificates of worker's compensation and liability insurance shall be provided to the RUSD within ten (10) days of signing this Agreement.

8.0 Background Check/DOJ Clearance

Consultant must submit or have submitted their fingerprint live scan to DOJ for clearance: All of the Consultant's employees or independent contractors who may come in contact with pupils must also have this clearance. All of the Consultant's employees or independent contractors who may come in contact with pupils must also have current TB clearance.

The Consultant shall certify in writing to the RUSD that none of its employees who may come in contact with pupils have been convicted of a violent or serious felony (Penal Code § 667.5(c), 1192.7 (c). (Attach Certification Letter)

9.0 Cancellation

This agreement may be cancelled by RUSD or Consultant upon the giving of ten (10) days advance written notice. Such notice shall be personally served or given by United States Mail. In the event of cancellation, Consultant shall be paid for all work performed to the date of cancellation.

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In Addition, RUSD may terminate this Agreement for cause should Consultant fail to perform any part of this Agreement. In the event of a termination for cause, RUSD may secure the required services from another Consultant. If the cost to RUSD exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this Agreement, Consultant shall pay the additional cost.

10.0 Hold Harmless and Indemnification

The Consultant agrees to hold harmless and to indemnity the RUSD for:

Any injury to person or property sustained by the Consultant or by any of the individuals participating in or associated with him/her, however, caused; and

Any injury to person or property sustained by any person firm or corporation, caused by any act, neglect, default or omission, of the Consultant, or of any person, firm, or corporation directly or indirectly employed by the Consultant upon or in connection with this agreement, or any other persons/parties services arising out of the or in the course of the term of this agreement, and the Consultant at his/her own cost, expense and risk, shall defend any, and all actions, suits or other legal proceedings that may be instituted against the RUSD for any such claim or demand, and pay or satisfy any judgment that may be rendered against the RUSD in any such action, suit or legal proceedings or result thereof.

11.0 Attorney's Fees

In the event of the commencement of suit to enforce any of the terms or conditions in this agreement, the prevailing party in such litigation shall be entitled to recover such sum as the court may fix as attorney's fees.

12.0 Notice

Any notice required to be provided to any party to this agreement shall be in writing and shall be considered effective as of the date of deposit with the United States Postal Service by certified or registered mail, postage prepaid, return receipt and addressed to the party as follows:






