Dear RUSD Families,

We wanted to reach out to let you know that we are continuing to gather important information about the 2019 novel coronavirus (COVID-19) recently identified in Wuhan, Hubei Province, China. We are closely monitoring the situation and as of today, there are no cases of coronavirus in our Rescue schools.

What are we doing?

Rescue Union School District remains in consistent contact with agency partners such as California Department of Health Care Services, the California Department of Public Health, the California Department of Education, El Dorado County Public Health Department, and the El Dorado County Office of Education, for ongoing information, guidance, and a coordinated effort regarding this virus.

We are working with our school staff to reiterate to our children about the importance of proper and frequent handwashing and also routinely cleaning frequently touched surfaces.

We already utilize medical grade disinfectants and cleaning products to keep our schools and classrooms sanitary and safe. We will also ensure classrooms have appropriate hand sanitizer in addition to soap and water.

What can you do?

Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol if soap and water are not available.

Stay home when you are sick. Remain at home until fever has been gone for at least 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medicines.

Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.

Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.

Seek immediate medical care if symptoms become more severe.
