Due to this new information, Rescue Union School District will be closed through the end of the 2019-2020 school year. Our Board of Trustees has consistently messaged, *"Our approach must be measured and thoughtful, always mindful of the safety and health of our students, families, teachers, and staff as top priority."* This decision to close through the end of the year deeply saddens our Board, as well as all of us. We do not make this decision lightly.
