I would also like to challenge you to try something with us. For the past four years, I have encouraged our staff to individually choose One Word for the year. It is now time to find that one word for 2021. I invite you to click here to read more about choosing <u>One Word</u> to give you meaning, mission, passion, and purpose in 2021 (rather than a list of resolutions that are easily broken). This idea comes from one of my favorite authors, Jon Gordon. I have personally practiced this for the past 6 years. My words have been Renewal, Courage, Capacity, Steadfast, Abundance, and Cultivate. Sometimes it takes a while for your word to find you. I suggest you think and listen to that still, quiet voice inside you and your word will come to you! ## Lastly, we have a COVID update for you:

**Pleasant Grove** had 1 student test positive, but only 3 students have to quarantine. Also, completely unrelated to the positive student, PG has a staff member who has tested positive, but no one was considered a close contact, so no one needs to quarantine.

Lake Forest has one student who is presumed positive, and we have quarantined the teacher and the 9 students in the cohort until we hear for sure whether the student is positive or not. If you have not received a phone call, your child is not in the cohort needing to be quarantined.

Jackson has one student who has tested positive, and 6 students need to quarantine.

Should your child, or anyone in your immediate family, or a close contact to your child test positive over winter break, please, please contact me at <u>colson@my.rescueusd.org</u> or (530) 672-4810. We also ask that you adhere to our health and safety protocols over break and if your child has any symptoms on January 4, please keep them home and contact your school office. We want to be able to keep our schools open.
