Happy Friday Frontier Parents and Students! What an adventurous few weeks we have all had! My motto for the week has been “A smooth sea never made a skilled sailor”!

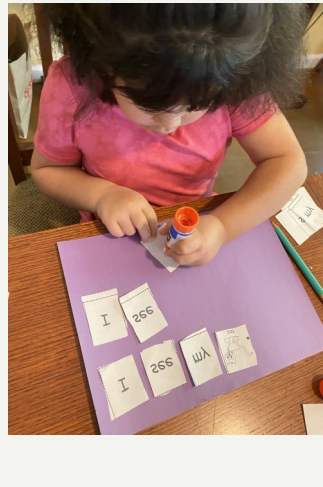

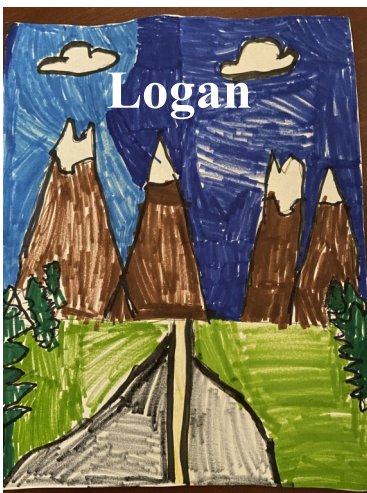
Ms. Heffington's super awesome 2nd graders have read 400 books already on EPIC!!!
