The Board adjourned to closed session to discuss matters of personnel, security, negotiations, student discipline, litigation, or other matters as authorized by Government Code Sections 3549.1, 54956.9, 54956.8, 54957, and 54957.6 and Education Code Sections 35146 and 48918.

OPEN SESSION:

Convened open session in the Boardroom at 6:35 p.m.

Welcome - The Board vice president provided an introduction to Board meeting proceedings.

Flag Salute - Board vice president led the flag salute.

1. Adoption of Agenda

(Consideration for Action)

Trustee White moved and Trustee Bebout seconded to adopt the agenda as presented. Motion passed 5-0.

REPORTS AND COMMUNICATION:

Report from Closed Session - Board President reported no action taken in closed session.

Superintendent's Report - The Superintendent presented a report on the continued Culture of Excellence and improvement emphasis in Rescue Union School District. Trainings and events in preparation for Back-to-School were covered including a special kickoff for families in need with donated supplies such as backpacks, new pairs of shoes, and giftcards for school items. MTSS Coordinator Dr. Jennifer Lawson and Community Liaison Sol Plasencia spearheaded the event. The District is also in process of improving facilities at several sites. Green Valley has a new TK classroom and Staff Room. Pleasant Grove Middle School's Central Kitchen area has been expanded to allow for more cooking and storage space to prepare and keep food fresh. Rescue Elementary has a new Multipurpose Room/Gymnasium under construction this school year. The Superintendent's Report highlighted volunteers across the district and projects and important work they contribute for various reasons at all of the RUSD sites. This summer, volunteers painted blacktops for recess games such as Four Square, and registered more parents for PTO and PTC groups. Also reported on is current, ongoing Safety Training with state-of-the-art phone systems that have immediate capability for initiating school and site lockdowns. The District has new, up-to-date radio devices and buses have upgraded seatbelts. The recent local fire off of Green Valley Road was an opportunity to learn more about handling emergencies, and leaning into disaster preparedness with planning and organization.

2. CSBA Call for Nominations for Legislative Awards

(Consideration for Action)

CSBA annually honors current members of Senate and Assembly as well as members of Congress, who have demonstrated strong leadership in public education and supported local school board governance.

Nominees must be from within district boundaries and received by September 1, 2024. The Superintendent recommended the Board consider submitting a nomination to CSBA.

CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION:

3. Preparation for the 2024-2025 School Year

(Information Only)

The Superintendent recommended the Board receive a report on the district's preparation for the 2024-2025 school year. Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction Dustin Haley presented a slideshow on the RISE Summer School Program, the Extended School Year (ESY) Program, the District's Leadership

Retreat, New Employee Orientation and Onboarding, and school site introduction and connection dates from TK/K orientations to the return of middle school activities such as the PGMS Puma Walk. RUSD has also had facilities modernization projects going on with new classroom and office space at Green Valley Elementary, new kitchen area expansion at Pleasant Grove Middle School, and construction underway to remodel the Multipurpose Center at Rescue Elementary.

There were no public comments.

4. Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) Dept. Update (Information Only)

The Superintendent recommended the Board hear a presentation on updates in the Multi-Tiered Systems of Support Department. Dr. Jennifer Lawson shared a high-level overview report of MTSS as a comprehensive framework. The “tiers” address student needs at various levels from academic, social-emotional and whole child growth bringing in cooperation from leadership and administration, the community and families, and daily assistance from faculty and staff. A July training conference for MTSS was attended by staff from six of seven RUSD schools, and provided important takeaways such as practical support applications to discuss and implement across grade levels. In addition, the District’s MTSS Playbook is being devised with standardized guidelines and recommendations for faculty and staff.

Trustee Gordon asked about the makeup of Tier 2 Playbook teams and the evaluative approach. Dr. Lawson replied with information on teachers, counselors, and aides who are included in assessments and care. She also said the playbook applies to many students in identification of behavioral concerns but the site teams analyze individual patterns and create tailored plans.

Trustee Hunter commented that the MTSS is a crucial and impressive tool and she is eager to learn more and see development within the district.

There were no public comments.

**AGREEMENT
REGARDING ALLOCATION OF
SCHOOL MITIGATION FEES**

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between El Dorado Union High School District (hereinafter "High School District"), and the Rescue Union School District, ("Rescue Union"), and for reference purposes is dated as of July 1, 2024.

RECITALS:

- A. High School District and Rescue Union have common territorial jurisdiction.
- B. The High School District and Rescue Union hereby wish to enter into an agreement pertaining to the distribution and allocation of school mitigation fees, including fees collected under Government Code Section 65995 et seq. (Level I Fees), fees collected under Government Code Section 65995.5 (Level II Fees), fees collected under Government Code 65995.7 (Level III Fees) and other possible fee agreements with developers.
- C. Rescue Union and the High School District have entered into previous agreements regarding the allocation of Level I, Level II, Level III Fees and it is appropriate for the Parties to renew the understanding and agreement regarding the allocation of such school mitigation fees.
- D. The allocation of school mitigation fees detailed herein is considered by the respective School Districts to be in the best interests of the elementary and secondary educational community in light of all relevant considerations, and is not based on a particular formula.

Agreement

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

1. The Level I Fees collected within the boundaries of Rescue Union pursuant to Government Code Section 65995, including those increases caused by periodic inflationary increases, shall be allocated as follows: thirty-nine percent (39%) of the Level I Fees collected within the Rescue Union School District boundary shall be allocated to the High School District and sixty-one percent (61%) of the Level I Fees shall be allocated to Rescue Union. Pursuant to Government Code Section 65995.5(d), if one of the Districts herein ceases to collect a Level I Fee and elects instead to collect a Level II Fee or a Level III Fee,

the other District may not increase their percentage share of the Level I fee. Instead, such other District shall continue to collect its same percentage share provided herein of the Level I Fee.

2. In the event either Rescue Union or the High School District levy and collect Level II Fees pursuant to Government Code Section 65995.5, each such District shall be entitled to 100% of the Level II fees levied and collected by the District within its boundaries. Level II fees shall not be allocated or shared between the Districts. Each District reserves the right on a project-by-project basis to determine whether to collect Level I or Level II fees for such project.

3. In the event that either Rescue Union or the High School District levy and collect Level III Fees pursuant to Government Code Section 65995.7, each such District shall be entitled to 100% of the Level III fees levied and collected by the District within its boundaries. Level III Fees shall not be allocated or shared between the Districts.

4. Additional school mitigation fees imposed through the land development process either through negotiated agreements with developers or through project conditions imposed by the County of El Dorado and collected within the boundaries of Rescue Union, including those increases due to periodic inflationary increases, shall be allocated as follows: thirty-nine percent (39%) of the fees collected within Rescue Union shall be allocated to High School District and sixty-one percent (61%) of such fees shall be allocated to Rescue Union. In the event a School Fee Mitigation Agreement between Rescue Union and the High School District provides for a different allocation between the Parties for a particular development project, the specific allocation agreed upon in the School Fee Mitigation Agreement shall prevail over the allocation herein provided.

5. In the event that either District ceases to be eligible to collect or does not collect its portion of a Level I Fee or a special Fee, then the District that can justify the collection of such fees shall be entitled to collect that portion of the Level I Fee or special Fee that the other District is unable to justify or does not collect. Thus, a District that is collecting a Level II fee may elect instead to collect a Level I fee on a particular project if the other District will not collect its share of the Level I fee on such project. In no event shall a District collect both a Level I and a Level II fee on the same project.

6. This Agreement shall become effective upon approval by the Parties hereto. The term of this Agreement shall be from **July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025**. Superintendents representing each of the Parties to this Agreement are encouraged to meet at least six (6) months prior to the expiration date of June 30, 2027, to discuss amending or extending the terms of this Agreement. Nothing

herein shall invalidate, supersede, amend or modify prior agreements, understanding, or obligations between the Parties regarding the levy, collection and distribution of school mitigation fees under such prior agreements, understandings, or obligations. In the event the parties have not entered into a new agreement regarding the allocation of school mitigation fees by June 30, 2027, this agreement shall continue in full force and effect until a new agreement is entered into by the parties, unless one of the parties provides a notice in writing to the other party objecting to the continuation of the agreement.

7. Miscellaneous Provisions.

7.1 Notice. All notices, approvals, consents or other documents required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing and, except as otherwise provided herein, shall be effective upon personal delivery or five (5) days after being sent by registered or certified mail, postage fully prepaid addressed as follows:

Or to such other address as either party shall, from time to time, specify in the manner provided herein.

7.2. Warranty of Authority. The Parties signing this agreement warrant to the other that the persons executing this Agreement on behalf of the respective Parties have been duly authorized to sign this Agreement and perform its terms.

7.3. Entire Agreement. This agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof, and no addition to or modification of any term or provision shall be effective unless set forth in writing, signed by all parties hereto.

7.4. Severability. If any phrase, sentence, clause or provision of this agreement is held invalid, the balance of the agreement shall not be

affected and the agreement shall be construed to the fullest extent of the law to effectuate the terms of this agreement.

7.5 California Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.

7.6 Waivers. No waiver by any Party of any provision hereof shall be deemed a waiver of any other provision hereof or of any subsequent breach by either Party of the same or any other provision.

7.7 Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which, together, shall constitute one and the same Agreement.
