#### **REPORTS AND COMMUNICATION:**

Report from Closed Session - Board president reported no action taken in closed session.

Superintendent's Report - The Superintendent presented a report on Bright Spots happening within the district, including student athletes performing at high levels in their classrooms and sports, school PTO and PTC groups hosting amazing and well-attended celebrations and gatherings, and dedicated staff in RUSD with an average of 15 years of service showing spirit and dedication. Also mentioned were community partnerships such as the existing relationship with RUSD event sponsor SchoolsFirst Federal Credit Union, district department employees who go the extra mile to maintain campus sites, and create and serve meals, and safely transport students to and from their neighborhoods, field trips and team events.

California School Bus Safety Month Proclamation - Superintendent Shoemake presented a proclamation, read aloud by the Board vice president, stating Rescue Union School District recognizes the month of October 2023 as California School Bus Safety Month.

School Administrator Week Proclamation - Superintendent Shoemake presented a proclamation, read aloud by the Board vice president, stating Rescue Union School District recognizes October 8-14, 2023 as the Week of the School Administrator.

Celebrating Excellence in Our Schools - Green Valley Elementary Principal, Michelle Winberg, provided a site update with information on "The Gator Way" incorporating the Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) framework, student incentives such as reward tickets, and staff and faculty studying educational book "Setting Limits in the Classroom" together and including brainstorming in their meetings.

Guidance counseling was highlighted as a character building and assisting process with GV Guidance Counselors on campus all recess every day helping kids with socio-emotional regulation. Student leadership has established committees, helpers, and other roles for participants such as announcement makers. Student enrichments are going very well and offer a variety of opportunities for interested groups such as spanish, art, etc. The GV garden has grown and all are proud to share harvested pumpkins this time of year. Choir is very popular and has 80 kids from 2nd-5th grades. The school is under construction for new office space and a converted room to allow more space for incoming TK classes.

#### 4. Nutrition Services Update

(Information Only)

The Superintendent recommended the Board receive a presentation on the district's nutrition program. Kim Andreasen, Director of Food Services provided the report. The presentation highlighted great staff across RUSD kitchen sites managing the high volume of food and inventory with increasing numbers of fresh meals prepared and served, including recent additions at specific sites like MVMS where they now have a new program for the 10-minute "nutrition break." The reports covered partnerships past and current such as one with El Dorado Food Bank. Key points cited were menu development, the in-process goal of 40% scratch made food with quality brands such as Miller's Hot Dogs and produce from local farmers, updated staff trainings for recipe creation and machine operation, and the creation of inviting spaces for students with fun decor. Current challenges the Food Department faces include staffing shortages and lack of storage space. Samples of overnight oats, chicken and rice, cinnamon pan bread and chips and salsa were provided to all Trustees and Cabinet. Most or all extra food can be used over time, with little to no waste. There were no public comments.

# 5. Solar Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) Proposal

(Consideration for Action)

The Superintendent recommended the Board approve the Solar Power Purchase Agreement (PPA). Lisa Donaldson, Assistant Superintendent of Business Services, provided the contract draft based on a PPA informational report the Board received in the spring of 2023. Cost savings to the district were emphasized. Building and construction at sites would begin in summer 2024 and will take place in school parking lots.
